Darsham Emergency Plan

Introduction

Risks_

In response to a major incident (defined as a situation or incident likely to endanger life or property) ,help may not be immediately available from the emergency services or local authorities. It is therefore sensible to have a community emergency plan in place with the Parish Council and a team of local volunteers to initially manage the situation .

In some circumstances a request may be made by the emergency services themselves or the Local Authority(LA)

The emergency officer will activate the plan after consultation with other members of the Parish Council Emergency Team (PCET). Keeping the Emergency Services and LA informed of the situation is vital and a log of communication is required.

Severe weather conditions, snow resulting in deep drifts, vehicular accidents or pedestrian accidents, high winds, loss of power supplies, serious accidents on the A12 or level crossing are probably the most likely incidents.

Self-Help Kit

Anything you may feel will assist you in an emergency

First-aid kit and any essential medication

Torch and spare batteries or a wind up torch

Candles and matches or camping lanterns

Blankets and waterproof warm clothing

Mobile phone with charger and with useful emergency telephone numbers

Camping stove and gas.

Wellington boots

Bottled water and non perishable foods

Baby food and baby care items if applicable and /or pet food and leadsBottled water and non -perishable foods

If time permits key personal documents and possibly home insurance documents.

If you have to be evacuated and there is sufficient time, turn off gas, electricity and water at the mains, lock all doors/windows and bring essential items from your emergency kit.

Likewise if a severe storm is anticipated, limit potential damage and injury by securing items that may be blown into windows or across gardens and roads

Check-in on neighbours and vulnerable residents.

Local Resources

If the need to evacuate residents for a length of time, the Village Hall has been assessed and identified as an official Rest Centre by the LA

In addition this means that the Darsham Emergency Team may be called on to assist Emergency Services and Local Authority with incidents in our locality not necessarily involving local residents.

All Saints Church is a stand-by place of shelter.

Communication

Communication is a vital aspect of emergency response, a cascade system has been drawn up to speed communication and facilitate word of mouth contact. This is based on a number of villagers resident in the various parts of the village who will contact their neighbours to ascertain need and pass on knowledge.

In addition the village WhatsApp could be used but we need to be mindful not all residents use this service.

The Emergency Officer(EO) or a designated person will set the communication tree in progress. The Emergency services and LA need to be kept informed of the situation with the Emergency team documenting actions and results as a record of events.

- East Suffolk Council has requested you activate your plan and volunteer group.
- The CEPG volunteers are registered with the CEPG.
- The CEPG and volunteers are under the direction of a local authority member of staff (this can be remotely), and the local authority receives regular updates of the task,progress/issues arising.
- They only carry out activities/actions that they have been authorised to do or agreed by the LA.
- A record of the activities undertaken and volunteers employed in those tasks is maintained by CEPG..
- Activities that have been asked to undertake must be commensurate with their skills and competency.

- Appropriate risk assessments have been carried out.
- The use of cars is not covered by the local authority's insurance and it is the responsibility of the individual.
